camp. Campers were challenged to step outside their comfort zones with staff trained specifically to meet their needs.



Camp Tatiyee was accredited by the American Camp Association again. This

just goes to prove that camp is on the cutting edge of health, safety, and program quality.



Campers received the highest level of care from staff. Our staff to camper ratio is 1:1 during total care sessions, 1:3 for more independent campers, and 1:4 during ambulatory sessions.



Aspen – our first cabin in over 40 years – was built and it's gorgeous! It sleeps 16 people, has a common area, kitchen, and two handicapaccessible bathrooms.

I wasn't sure what to expect when I put in my application to work at Camp Tatiyee. I was nervous at the start. Would it be worth it? I quickly learned that camp was the best decision I could have made. Never in my life have I learned and grown so much in such a short amount of time. I was taught lessons from staff younger than me and older than me, from campers who were seven years old, and from campers who were 65 years old.



One of the lessons I learned is that we are all more capable than we think. I watched homesick, nervous campers who were afraid to try new things transform into adventurous, confident people who would get up on stage and sing in front of a crowd. I got to experience campers swimming for the first time in their lives, hitting a bullseye with a bow and arrow, and having a blast getting dressed up and dancing to their favorite songs. Nothing compares to the feeling of realizing you can accomplish things that you never thought were possible. I felt this as a staff member and was able to watch campers feel that pride each and every week. Camp taught me that anything is possible and that anyone can do anything they set their mind to.

Camp is truly a unique place for anyone and everyone that sets foot there. Working at Camp Tatiyee was an experience that I will cherish for the rest of my life."
